Dear Tribal Members and Tribal Government Representatives:

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Little Rock District (Corps) requests comments from your Tribal Government regarding a permit request from Mitico, LLC for authorization for the establishing forested and emergent wetland habitats at the proposed mitigation bank site. The proposed mitigation site will restore and protect 1.8 acres of forested wetlands and 23.2 acres of emergent wetlands, generating 112.86 wetland credits. These restored habitats will reduce nutrient pollution and runoff into the Black River Watershed while supporting a diverse community of native plants. Wetland habitats will support native wildlife including species of conservation concern found in the service area, and the restored wetland hydrology will help reduce the impact of future flood events on areas downstream along and the Black River. Enclosed is the Public Notice detailing the project. The lead Federal agency for this project will be Corps of Engineers Little Rock District. The project is located in Black River, in the SE 1/4 of section 25, T. 24 N, R. 6 E, SE of Poplar Bluff, Butler County, Missouri.
